SUBJECT: Revised Compilation of Federal Ethics Laws (118th Congress)

The U.S. Office of Government Ethics (OGE) provides the Compilation of Federal Ethics Laws (Compilation) as an essential resource for Designated Agency Ethics Officials and other ethics officials to help ensure compliance with the Ethics in Government Act and other statutory requirements.

The 118th Congress passed legislation affecting ethics statutes in the Compilation. This Program Advisory details changes in the updated Compilation, which is available on OGE's website at www.oge.gov/compilation.

Changes to Ethics Statutes Reflected in the Compilation

Initially, the 118th Congress enacted legislation to amend the primary criminal bribery statute, 18 U.S.C. § 201, by including provisions prohibiting foreign officials from demanding bribes. However, later in the 118th Congress, these provisions were moved from 18 U.S.C. § 201 to the criminal statute governing demands by foreign officials for bribes, 18 U.S.C. § 1352, by the Foreign Extortion Prevention Technical Corrections Act. OGE's Compilation of Federal Ethics Laws has been revised accordingly and updated to include 18 U.S.C. § 1352.

At the end of the 118th Congress, Public Law 118-159 updated the criminal conflict of interest definitions, 18 U.S.C. § 202, and the criminal prohibition of the supplementation of salary, 18 U.S.C. § 209, to reference the United States Space Force.³

The Compilation also includes updated footnotes related to civil monetary penalties, which are adjusted annually by <u>inflation-adjustment rulemaking of OGE</u>.
